Cal-ESAR is one of four state mutual aid teams affiliated with the California Emergency Management Agency, Law Enforcement Division. Cal-ESAR has been active in Search and Rescue since 1971 and has responded to over 280 searches. There are approximately 100 active members of all ages on the team.

Cal-ESAR has an eight-month training cycle that runs from October to May. There is a training preparation meeting held the first Wednesday evening of each month, with one two-day field training, each month, at various locations in and around the Bay Area. In addition, there is a nine-day Summer Camp held each year at Yosemite National Park and weekend outings in Yosemite on Memorial and Labor Day weekends.
